Purpose of the Fund









- Water Framework Directive (2000)
- Aim to reach GOOD status by 2027 at latest







To qualify, projects should:

- Restore historic pressures
- Work towards WFD objectives
 - Be on a river downgraded for morphology or fish passage
 - Restore the conditions (i.e. processes) that create habitats
- Fit with the catchment character and issues
- Have match funding
- Lead to other benefits where possible






















Future Strategy

RBMP 1 (2009 to 2015)

- 45 Active Projects: Channel work, barriers, INNS
- 50 Scoping studies in 100+ waterbodies

RBMP 2 (2015 to 2021)

- -Identify & prioritise restoration (Costs & feasibility)
- –National strategy (RBMP + key partners).
