## POLLUTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2012 CONSULTATION ON STANDARD RULES FOR DRY CLEANING ACTIVITIES

Please find enclosed a consultation on new draft standard rules for dry cleaning activities regulated under the Pollution Prevention and Control (Scotland) Regulations 2012.

Part IV of the Pollution Prevention and Control (Scotland) Regulations 2012 allows The Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA) to specify that standard rules are to be conditions of a permit. It is planned to introduce this approach to the regulation of dry cleaning activities in 2016.

The standard rules will make no changes to the way you operate your process. You will still be required to submit a report to SEPA each year detailing your annual solvent emission calculation. The solvent emission limit will remain at 20 grams of solvent used per kilogram of products cleaned and dried. For further information please see the enclosed consultation document.

Before the standard rules are introduced, we would like to seek views on the detail of how these standard rules would be applied. It is important that we get your views before we implement the standard rules and this document provides you with an opportunity to have your say on our proposals. We will consider any comments received and incorporate relevant points into the standard rules before they are issued in 2016.
