General Registration Conditions

- 1. The disinfectant or detergent must be diluted to the correct working strength in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions
- 2. Only disinfectants approved by DEFRA for the disease should be disposed of.
- 3. The number of disposals made on each of the disposal areas must not exceed 5 (five) per annum.
- 4. Disposals must not be made when the soil is waterlogged, cracked (due to drought), frozen, covered in snow or when heavy rain is forecast.
- 5. Disposals must not:
 - be made to land within 250m of any well, spring, borehole used for human consumption.
 - be made to land within 10m of :
 - ~ a river, burn, ditch or loch, as measured from the top of the bank
 - ~ wetland;
 - ~ transitional water or coastal water as measured from the shoreline; or
 - opening into any surface water drainage system.
 - lead to damage of a Site of Special Scientific Interest or cause a significant effect on a Natura site
 - be made to land which has less than 40cm of soil
 - be made to soil with a texture of sand or loamy sand
 - be made to land which has less than 40cm of soil covering any drain under the site.
- 6. The matter must be applied to the surface of the disposal areas by a method which must ensure even distribution on or to the disposal areas at a rate not exceeding 20 cubic metres per hectare.
- 7. Disposals must be made at a rate which is not greater than the infiltration capacity of the soil such that the disposal might cause surface run off or pooling of the matter on the disposal areas.
- 8. Other than as specifically permitted or limited by any condition of this authorisation, the Authorised Activity must not have a significant adverse impact on, or cause pollution of, the water environment.

Important information

If your activity is registered, it will require to be carried out in accordance with the terms of the application, and the conditions detailed above. To contravene the terms of the application or the conditions would constitute an offence under regulation 44 of the Water Environment (Controlled Activities) (Scotland) Regulations 2011.

It is an offence under regulation 44 of the Water Environment (Controlled Activities) (Scotland) Regulations 2011 to make a statement which you know to be false or misleading in any material particular, or recklessly make a statement which is false or misleading in any material particular for the purpose of obtaining a registration (for ourself or anyone else) or seeking a variation of a registration.
