FIXED MONETARY PENALTY NOTICE

To: The Firm of D & J Thomson

Aberfeldy Perthshire PH15

The Scottish Environment Protection Agency ("SEPA"), hereby notifies you, that you are liable to a Fixed Monetary Penalty (FMP) because SEPA is satisfied on the balance of probabilities that you have committed a relevant offence prescribed under the Order, namely an offence under Section 33(6) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

Grounds for imposing the penalty:

SEPA is satisfied that the firm of D & J Thomson disposed of controlled waste on land without the authority of a waste management licence on the date and at the location specified below, in that a partner acting on behalf of the partnership disposed of waste there by burning and there is no waste management licence in place for the land. This is contrary to the Environmental Protection Act 1990, Section 33(1)(b)(i).

In terms of Section 33(1)(b)(i) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, a person shall not dispose of controlled waste in or on any land except under and in accordance with a waste management licence.

Disposal means any of the waste disposal operations listed in Part II of Schedule 4 of the Waste Management Licensing (Scotland) Regulations 2011 and any other operation relating to waste which is not recovery, even where it has a secondary consequence. The burning of controlled waste is considered a waste disposal operation.

It is an offence under Section 33(6) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to contravene Section 33(1)(b)(i).

On 23 August 2022, two authorised SEPA Officers attended the location specified below following a report of burning on 21 August 2022. SEPA Officers observed the remnants of a fire. On closer inspection of said remnants, SEPA Officers were able to identify a number of items of controlled waste piled within the area, including treated wood, a red bike, a double bed, a mattress, a pillow, unmarked white plastic 5L container, half used roll of silage wrap, fencing wire, carpet samples, plastic drinks bottles, polypropylene bags and metals. The pile also included the burnt remains of wood, plastics and carpet. Photographs of these waste items were taken by an authorised SEPA Officer.



On 21 December 2022, authorised SEPA Officers interviewed under caution. During the interview, confirmed was a partner of the firm D & J Thomson and that decisions regarding the location specified below are made by both as partners of said firm. also confirmed during the interview that on 21 August 2022, had set alight the waste items in the pile detailed above, that were later found by SEPA officers to have been burnt.
SEPA is satisfied, based on the above interview under caution and the observations made by two authorised SEPA Officers at the location specified below, that the firm of D & J Thomson through being a partner of said partnership and acting on behalf of the partnership, disposed of controlled waste by burning on the date and at the location specified below.
SEPA is satisfied that this was a waste disposal activity and that the firm of D & J Thomson has no authorisation to dispose of controlled waste by burning at the location specified below.
Date of offence: 21 August 2022
Location of offence: Aberfeldy.
The amount of the FMP is £600.
You are required to pay the sum in full within 56 days beginning with the day this notice is served on you.

Amount of Penalty and effect of payment

The penalty has been set in accordance with the Environmental Regulation (Enforcement Measures) (Scotland) Order 2015 ("the Order").

How to Pay a Fixed Monetary Penalty

Acceptable payment methods are: Personal or Company Cheques, Debit Card, Credit Card, Postal Orders, and BACS.

Late payment and Non-payment

If you do not pay the full amount owed within 56 days beginning with the day this notice is served on you, the amount due will be increased by 40% in accordance with the Order. SEPA can recover sums due but not paid in full as a civil debt.

Appeals

You can appeal against this Notice to the Scottish Land Court within 28 days beginning with the date of service of this Notice on the grounds that:

- The decision was based on an error of fact
- The decision was wrong in Law
- The decision was unreasonable
- any other reason, (with the exception that the Order states that it is not a valid ground of appeal that SEPA failed to comply with the Guidance issued to it by the Lord Advocate under the Act).

You should submit your Appeal to The Scottish Land Court, George House, 126 George Street, Edinburgh, EH2 4HH. An application form for an appeal can be obtained by contacting the Court on 0131 271 4360 or from the Court's website at http://www.scottish-land-court.org.uk/using/making-an-application. It would be helpful if you also sent a copy of your appeal documentation to SEPA, The Registry Department, Angus Smith Building, 6 Parklands Avenue, Eurocentral, Holytown, Motherwell, ML1 4WQ.

The bringing of an appeal will have the effect of suspending payment of the penalty until after the appeal has been determined or withdrawn.
